

RTW Charitable Foundation Grant Terms and Conditions

General Grant and Payment Conditions

1. The Grantee agrees that no more than 10% of the Grant amount will be used by the Grantee to cover institutional overhead costs.
2. The Grant is for the period of 1 year.
3. The Grant will be used only for the project described in the Request, which project furthers exclusively religious, charitable, scientific, literary, educational or other exempt purposes described in section 170(c)(2)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").
4. No part of the Grant will be used to attempt to influence legislation or the outcome of any specific public election, to carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive, or to undertake any activities for any purpose that would not be deemed to be a religious, charitable, scientific, literary, educational or other exempt purpose described in Code section 170(c)(2)(B).
5. The Grant, as well as income earned from any investment of the Grant funds, will not be expended for any other project without the Foundation's prior written approval.
6. The Grant funds will be expended substantially in accordance with the budget included in the Request.
7. (a) If any part of the Grant is not expended or committed for the project as described in the Request, the Grant Recipient will notify the Foundation, whereupon the Foundation will have the absolute right to change the terms of or cancel the Grant; and (b) if the Grant is cancelled, the Grant Recipient agrees to return the full amount of the Grant to the Foundation immediately and to provide an accounting as to the use of any expended funds.

Reporting

8. Submit one 6-month update report and one final project report. These reports should contain: (a) a description and update of the research project including hypothesis and number of participants; (b) latest project research data findings and analysis, and (c) a financial accounting as to the use and disposition of the Grant funds, signed by a financial officer of the Grant Recipient.
9. The Foundation may monitor the progress of the project financed by the Grant (including by making site visits), discuss the project, its implementation, and finances with representatives of the Grant Recipient, and review records and other material, including financial records, connected with the project.

Recognition

10. Donor's support will be referenced in any scholarly papers emanating from research supported by Donor's gift and in any research presentations where it is standard to acknowledge funding sources.
11. Participate in a press release and social media posts to highlight the important research work of the Grant Recipient and the contribution from the Foundation.
